By now, most of us know about basic recycling. We recycle soda cans and computer paper; we use reusable bags for the grocery store; we turn off and unplug the lights before we leave the house. But the #1 threat to our environment is still out there. We rarely think of our computers as harmful. Obsolete and clunky, yes. But rarely do we think of computer monitors, old televisions, and electrical wires as harmful and hazardous.

E-waste - think of it as anything that you plug in that you want to throw out – makes up of only about 2% of our landfills, yet contributes to about 70% of our toxic waste. E-waste leaches mercury and other toxins into our earth and it finds its way into our water supplies. So, why aren't more of us recycling our e-waste? Why do we continue to ignore, or worse, throw away our e-waste? The truth of the matter is that it's just not convenient or easy to get rid of those old television sets, printers, and computers.

GREENspot DROPoff even provides a print out form that you can fill out at home and then bring it to the DROPoff location to save time. (fyi – California State Law requires that every piece of e-waste be personally accounted for by a California State resident in the form of an e-waste log.)

But GREENspot DROPoff goes beyond making e-waste recycling convenient. They partner with local schools and charities to provide a no-touch, year-round fundraising alternative that is free and convenient to the community.
